## ***Busy Agenda Awaits ESC Commissioners On July 22 In Charlotte At CPCC***

**RALEIGH** — A wide variety of agenda items — from greeting a new commissioner to receiving public input to hearing two unemployment insurance cases — will come before members of the North Carolina Employment Security Commission during a meeting set for Wednesday, July 22, at Central Piedmont Community College in Charlotte.

The meeting will begin at 10:30 a.m. in Harris Building 2, 3216 CPCC Harris Campus Drive. ESC Chairman Moses Carey Jr. is continuing a new practice of having a “ESC Public Listening Session” on the agenda to collect comments from interested businesses and individuals.

One of the first items of business will be to introduce Charles Roth of Greensboro to the board and public as the newest ESC Commission member. Roth was appointed to the Commission on July 1 by N.C. Gov. Beverly Perdue. Currently, he works for the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, both nationally and locally. A news release with additional information about his appointment is attached.

## ***Gov. Perdue Names Greensboro's Charles Roth To N.C. Employment Security Commission***

**RALEIGH** — Charles Roth of Greensboro is the newest member of the N.C. Employment Security Commission, having been appointed to that body by Gov. Beverly Perdue on July 1.

“We are happy to have Charles Roth on the Commission and welcome him,” said ESC Chairman Moses Carey Jr. “He brings a wide variety of experience in numerous areas which will greatly benefit the board.”

Roth has an extensive history with the International Brotherhood Of Teamsters, serving the union both nationally and locally since 1983. Currently, he serves as an International Representative for the union's headquarters in Washington, D.C. In this capacity, he is often assigned to help workers and local unions involved in difficult organizing campaigns, or contract negotiations. One of Roth's specialities is participating in labor relations in the brewing and soft-drink industries across the U.S., working with major companies in those fields.

Roth also serves as a business agent for the Teamsters Local 391, which is based in Greensboro and represents United Parcel Service employees at their jobsites in Winston-Salem and High Point. He also negotiates labor contracts for the local union with major companies in Greensboro, Raleigh, Mount Airy and Winston-Salem.

From 1999-2000, he served Teamsters General President James P. Hoffa in Washington, D.C. by managing all internal communications and external public relations for the Teamsters union across North America as Director of Communications for the International Brotherhood Of Teamsters.

Roth is married to Denise Turner, Assistant City Manager for the City of Greensboro. He is active in several area civic organizations, including the Future Fund, which promotes philanthropy and investment in Greensboro. The Roths are co-chairs of a major fundraising event that will take place this fall to benefit the city's International Civil Rights Center & Museum. Roth is an honors graduate of the University of Pittsburgh.
